# B-N killer fled with only \$60

To the man who killed him, the life of 18-year-old William Little was worth about \$60.

That's roughly how much money was in the cash drawer when an unknown assailant shot Little twice in the chest during a robbery Sunday night at a Bloomington service station.

At 8:41 p.m., he was dead at the scene. An autopsy yesterday indicated both bullets went through his heart.

Little, of 2 Wilmette Drive, Normal, had been working at Clark Super 100 Service Station, 802 E. Empire St., for about four months. But according to a friend, for the last six weeks he had talked about quitting because the work was boring and he didn't like the hours.

"But he couldn't find another job," said Danny Hartley, 17, of 904 N. Morris Ave.,

going person just doing his thing," visited his friend at the service station about an hour before the fatal shooting.

"When I was there, he asked if I would stay and talk to him for a while," said a tearful Hartley. "I don't know if that meant anything, but he asked me three or four times. But I had someplace to go, so I left. Any other time I would have been there."

Hartley said his friend regularly made "drops" in the gas station's safe when he accumulated more than enough cash to make change for typical customers. "There was never much more than \$60 in the cash drawer," he said. "That's not worth nobody's life, especially his."

Meanwhile, police are continuing to investigate the slaying. There was no security camera in the station, but several people were in the vicinity when the assailant fled, and authorities have used their descriptions to produce a composite drawing.

The suspect is described as a white male in his mid-20s, with blue eyes, blond hair, a mustache and a ruddy complexion. He is about 6 feet, 2 inches tall and has a slender build. According to witnesses, the man left the scene in a brown sedan with out-of-state license plates. However, police said yesterday that a vehicle matching that description was checked out and turned up nothing.

According to police, a man with a similiar description robbed the same Clark station Dec. 26. He also was described as in his 20s, with

blue eyes, blond hair and a slender build. However, he is supposed to be about 5 feet 10 inches tall and has a fair complexion.

Lt. Bill Emmett of the Bloomington police said yesterday that he has "no idea" whether the incidents are related.

Crimestoppers of McLean County is offering a reward of up to \$2,500 to anyone with information leading to the arrest and indictment of the person responsible for the slaying. Anyone with information should call 828-1111. Callers may remain anonymous.

Meanwhile, people who knew Little can't believe he is gone. "He was an all-around good boy," said Terry Milt, principal of LeRoy High School. "I'm very saddened by the loss."

# FBI FACT SHEET

- **The primary functions of the FBI are national security and law enforcement.**
- **The FBI does not keep a file on every citizen of the United States.**
- **The FBI was not established until 1908 and we have very few records prior to the 1920s.**
- **FBI files generally contain reports** of FBI investigations of a wide range of matters, including counterterrorism, counter-intelligence, cyber crime, public corruption, civil rights, organized crime, white collar crime, major thefts, violent crime, and applicants.
- **The FBI does not issue clearances or non-clearances for anyone other than its own personnel or persons having access to FBI facilities.** Background investigations for security clearances are conducted by many different Government agencies. Persons who received a clearance while in the military or employed with some other government agency should contact that entity. Most government agencies have websites which are accessible on the internet which have their contact information.
- **A criminal history summary check or “rap sheet” is NOT the same as an “FBI file.”** It is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and related documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization or military service. The subject of a “rap sheet” may obtain a copy by submitting a written request to FBI, Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division, Record Request, 1000 Custer Hollow Road, Clarksburg, West Virginia 26306. Along with a specific written request, the individual must submit a new full set of his/her fingerprints in order to locate the record, establish positive identification, and ensure that an individual's records are not disseminated to an unauthorized person. The fingerprint submission must include the subject's name, date and place of birth. There is a required fee of \$18 for this service, which must be submitted by money order or certified check made payable to the Treasury of the United States. A credit card payment option is also available. Forms for this option and additional directions may be obtained by accessing the FBI Web site at [www.fbi.gov/about-us/cjis/background-checks/background\\_checks](http://www.fbi.gov/about-us/cjis/background-checks/background_checks).
- **The National Name Check Program (NNCP)** conducts a search of the FBI's Universal Index (UNI) to identify any information contained in FBI records that may be associated with an individual and provides the results of that search to a requesting federal, state or local agency. Names are searched in a multitude of combinations and phonetic spellings to ensure all records are located. The NNCP also searches for both “main” and “cross reference” files. A main file is an entry that carries the name corresponding to the subject of a file, while a cross reference is merely a mention of an individual contained in a file. The results from a search of this magnitude can result in several “hits” and “idents” on an individual. In each instance where UNI has identified a name variation or reference, information must be reviewed to determine if it is applicable to the individual in question.
- **The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS)** searches for records and provides copies of FBI files responsive to Freedom of Information or Privacy Act (FOIPA) requests for information. RIDS provides responsive documents to requesters seeking “reasonably described information.” For a FOIPA search, the subject's name, event, activity, or business is searched to determine whether there is an associated investigative file. This is called a “main file search” and differs from the **NNCP** search.
