

On 02-27-92 at approximately 0300 AM I was paged at my residence and asked to respond to the scene of an armed robbery/shooting. I first responded to BPD for equipment and to pick up the Crime Scene Van.

At approximately 0345 AM I arrived at 2507 East Oakland Ave. and spoke with Officers which were guarding the Crime scene. Officers Bob Siron who was inside the Krogers store awaiting my arrival and Officers Jeff Klepec and his trainee, and Officer Peter Avery. These officers were at the west side of the Krogers building guarding a dumpster containing a weapon and some footwear in mud near the west end of this building. I spoke with the Officers outside briefly and then responded to the store itself. I met with Officer Siron who told me what he knew of the account from victim and witness information. The area had been secured by roping off from the area of the Lane #4 cash register to the door exited by the suspect.

I began by using the electrostatic dust print lifter over the entire area of floor where the suspect would have walked. I did recover several footwear prints but, was unable to match any to the suspects shoes which had been obtained during and following his arrest.

Various items of evidential value were photographed and recovered by R/O during the time of the crime scene search/processing. See Evidence Log for evidence recovered and the location of its recovery.

I then processed for latent prints the cash register, the conveyor belt and immediate area of lane #4 where the victim had been shot with negative results. I processed the glass and steel door where the suspect had exited the store recovering latents marked as AA, BB, CC, and DD from the inside glass portion of the door.

Laying on the conveyor belt at cash register #4 were two paper cash register receipts and four pennies, along with a Big K cola 2 liter bottle. I was informed that the suspect had purchased the cola and had paid for it prior to pulling the weapon and committing the armed robbery. One of the paper receipts was for a bottle of cola and had the date 2-27-92 and the time 2:36 AM along with the words Big K cola the price and the amount tendered and the change due. These receipts and the pennies along with the cola bottle were collected as evidence.

I also collected the victims smock which clearly has a hole in the chest area of the smock.

Upon clearing from the store I then observed and photographed some fresh footwear impressions in a muddy area just to the west of the west end of the building in which Krogers is housed. These footwear impressions were found in two directions both going toward Krogers in a North east direction and going away from Krogers in a South west direction. I was able to follow the footwear and photograph them down in a grassy muddy area just north of a driveway at 810 Four seasons Rd. These footwear impressions were also in both a westerly direction and a Easterly direction.

I then cleared and went to Browns Towing service and did a search of the vehicle the suspect was in as a passenger when arrested. I recovered a Black baseball type cap with "Notre Dame Fighting Irish" on the bill.
