

1 words, man, I fucked up, bro, and he goes on to tell Randy  
2 Howard how he shot the guy at the Clark station and that the  
3 robbery went wrong or words to that effect. And he told  
4 Randy Howard that he was very concerned that somebody might  
5 have seen him, and he talked about how he went to do an  
6 armed robbery and the kid recognized him, words to that  
7 effect, and that the gun accidentally went off. And when  
8 this defendant saw his buddy's reaction to what he was  
9 saying, he quickly said I was just kidding, I was just  
10 kidding.

11 And later when the composite came out and was  
12 released, the defendant told his buddy, Randy, how much the  
13 composite looked just like him, the defendant.

14 Within a few days of the shooting another friend  
15 of the defendant's, Ed Palumbo, was driving down the street  
16 in Bloomington and the defendant was also driving down that  
17 street with his wife and another female; and the two cars  
18 stopped and the defendant asked Ed, hey, did you read about  
19 me in the paper. And Ed, asked him, what are you talking  
20 about, and the defendant said, have gun, goes off, kid dies;  
21 and that conversation is corroborated by another person, Ed  
22 Palumbo's girlfriend at the time, who heard part of  
23 that conversation.

24 He later went on to tell Ed Palumbo that, you

1 know, I used to think that, you know, it would really feel  
2 bad to kill somebody, but, you know, the one thing after he  
3 shot and killed Bill Little that kind of surprised him it  
4 really didn't feel all that bad to kill and shoot somebody.

5           Within a few days after the shooting Bill Gaddis  
6 is present at a location here in Bloomington where the  
7 defendant was present and the shooting was discussed.  
8 Gaddis had gone to that apartment where one of this  
9 defendant's buddies, Denny Hendricks, lived. He was looking  
10 for his brother. And Gaddis walked into the back bedroom  
11 there and never in a million years would he have imagined  
12 what he was going to walk into. He opened the door and  
13 inside he saw this defendant, saw two other people who have  
14 since died, and three other people. And he noticed that  
15 these people, several of them, were visibly upset, and some  
16 of them were crying, including the defendant. And Gaddis  
17 thought somebody they all knew had died. And so he asked,  
18 who died. And Frankie Turner, who is now deceased, said  
19 Jamie shot the kid at the Clark station. And Gaddis looked  
20 at Jamie, this defendant, and the defendant looked back at  
21 Gaddis; and the defendant never denied a word of what had
