

Q He talk to you about that?

A Yeah, we talked about it.

Q He indicated he was relieved?

A Yeah.

Q When he got out of jail in '91, you guys left Bloomington, didn't you?

A Possibly.

Q Moved to Florida?

A Yeah.

Q Why did you move to Florida?

A That's where we always move to. I've been moving to Florida since I was 16 years old.

Q Wanted to get away from here?

A No. Actually I'm the one that wanted to move to Florida.

Q So Jamie never indicated he wanted to get away from here, wanted to get away from the police, get away from the case?

A No. That was not the reason we moved there if that's what you're asking.

Q Within the matter of two or three days after William Little was shot and killed at the Clark station in March of 1991, were you in a car on West Olive Street with Jamie and Susan Powell when you ran into Ed

Palumbo?

A Possibly.

Q Did you ever hear Jamie have a conversation where Jamie was asking Ed if he'd read about him in the paper?

A No. If he read about Ed in the paper?

Q If Ed had read about Jamie in the paper about what he did?

A No. I think it was more--I think it was more directed at Ed, not at Jamie.

Q You didn't hear Jamie say anything about have gun, shoot, kid dies?

A No. No. I think the conversation, it was like maybe a two to three minute conversation before Ed took off, but I think it was more like what did Ed do the night before. It wasn't directed at Jamie. Then Ed took off. That was like a two minute conversation. But I know, I've heard this story. I know this is the story I've heard over and over again. But Ed's, you know, kind of turned a little conversation around there a little bit.

Q Give us the conversation. How did it go?

A I have no idea. I know Jamie said something to Ed like you know what happened last night,

or I'm gonna read about you in the paper, or something like that, and Ed got all, looked at us all crazy and took off. And we were all like, whoa, you know. I mean I barely know the guy. I've met him a few times but.

Q Did you get a call in July of 1999 or did your sister get a call in July of 1999 from your brother Carl or Susan Claycomb telling them that the police were down there talking to them?

A Uh-huh.

Q What did you do after you talked to them? Who did you call?

A I don't know.

Q You called Jamie, didn't you?

A I don't believe--I don't know. I might have called Jamie.

Q Did you call Jamie and tell him that Susan Powell got stopped or pulled over in Tennessee and the police were questioning her about being the driver?

A Maybe I did.

Q Did you or didn't you?

A I don't think I called him that night. I might have talked to him the next day or--because when I was talking to Susan, my sister's phone went dead
