

was no longer involved in the case I continued to stay up on the case and to work with Jamie Snow. I wrote a social history report for Jamie Snow that was read into the record for sentencing.

5. When OSAD was still involved, I went to the gas station where Mr. Little was killed. I stood at the pumps and looked back at the Luna house and it was too far from the gas station for me to have identified someone at the Luna household. I don't believe Juan Luna could have identified someone in front of the gas station pumps.

6. As part of my work I also listened to a bunch of phone recordings from Mr. Little's mother to the police urging them to "get" Jamie Snow. I also know that Mrs. Little called Juan Luna and was pressing him to identify Jamie Snow.

7. I remember that Pat Reilly and Frank Picl were attorneys who worked on the case. Pat Reilly had a stroke and did not seem to be in charge. He was not up to doing this trial - he was not able to do so physically or mentally. Pat told me that he brought in Frank to be the "attack dog." It seemed to me that Frank Picl was in charge of Jamie's defense. Pat Reilly seemed more like a second chair to me.

8. Frank Picl never seemed prepared to me. When I talked to him about the case he seemed like he only had a superficial knowledge of the case. I saw him looking at discovery and then questioning witnesses where he had no notes.

9. I remember that at one point in the trial there was something going on that kept us there at night. There was some question that needed to be answered and no one could find Frank. He eventually showed up and I smelled alcohol on him. My professional assessment is that Frank Picl was an alcoholic at that time. I went out to lunch with Frank before the trial to talk

over the case and he drank alcohol during those lunches. He had 2-3 alcoholic drinks during those lunches.


10. At another point in the trial I remember talking with Frank and him telling me that he was separated from his wife and was living with his parents. He told me that his sister had accused him of stealing a ring from his mother to finance his gambling habit.

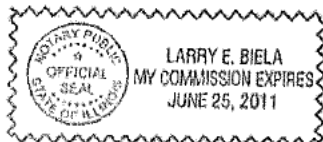
