At the time when you 6 answered the call in 91 do you remember there being a large 7 Clark Oil sign on that particular corner? 8 A I'm sure there was a sign. I couldn't tell you 9 where it was at or how tall it was or anything like that. 10 Q Towards the end of your testimony you indicated that 11 when Officer Williams arrived you stated it's real or words 12 to that effect? 13 A I said that on the radio, yes. 14 Q As he was arriving or before he arrived? 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A I'm trying to think. I've gone to several deaths. I was -- of the same style or armed robbery homicide, no.

Q Okay. Would that account for why you might have been kind of stressed because it might have been the first scene you've been to, crime scene, where somebody was dead?

A Memory serves me right, I believe it was indeed the first homicide where I was the first officer on the scene, yes.

Q Did you ever get dispatch to run the tag or the plate of the car of the guy who was trying to fill his tires in the parking lot when you arrived? Did they ever eventually run the plate for you?

They never ran it, no. A LEADS was down.

Was that what the argument was about? You stated you had an argument with the dispatcher whether or not she was going to run this for you.

A Yes, I asked her to run a 1028. She responded LEADS is down if I remember correctly. I come back and told her to hold it. She again responded LEADS is down. Eventually I got kind of upset with her and said just write it down then.

It never was run as far as you know?

A As far as I know she never put it on computer, no.

1	Q How long did it take you after you received the
2	initial call from dispatch to arrive at the credit union
3	parking lot?

Q Give me your best estimate of how long you went back and forth over your radio with dispatch in this attempt to get the plate run would you please? You told us in direct it was a prolonged conversation.

A It was longer than it should have been, yes; as far as seconds, I couldn't tell you exactly how many seconds it took.

Q Were you on your radio for the same length of time, less or more than it took you to get to the scene after receiving the initial 1090 call? I think you told us it took you two to three minutes to get to the scene after you got the initial call. Was that about the same length of time you were struggling over your radio with dispatch?

A No, it wasn't a couple minute conversation, no.

Q Would it have been a minute do you think?

A Not that long, I -- I asked for a license plate. She said it was down.

Q 30 seconds?

I don't even think it had been that long. 1 If you can't say, you can't say. 2 A Other than regoing through the conversation I 3 couldn't give you the amount of time it took. 4 Thank you. Now, you've told us that among Q Okay. 5 your concerns when approaching the station was to not 6 frighten off or alert any suspects who might be still there, 7 right? 8 Be one of your concerns, yes. 9 Tell me what some of your other concerns were. 10 Well, concerned whether a suspect is still there, 11 whether they fled and are hiding, whether it's an ambush for 12 me, whether you've got people in getaway cars that are 13 sitting there, lookout in the area, witnesses that might be 14 getting away because they're scared of what just happened, 15 concerned about getting run over walking across Empire. 16 Q Did you have any concern about finding out whether 17 or not the attendant in the station was in dire need of 18 help? 19 A Well, that's one of the concerns, yes. 20 Okay. Did you -- when he drove off apparently the 5 only suspect on foot in the area, did you call dispatch back 6 and ask them to or alert them in some fashion of the fact 7 8 that he'd driven off? A I don't remember if I advised whether he was leaving 9 10 the lot or not. Q Did he return at some point later in your time on 11 12 the scene that night at the gas station? A Yes, after -- after I had went in and found what 13 I -- the young man lying there, I had came out, made 14 announcement on the radios. Paul Williams was there. 15 Within moments after that he actually spoke to me from his 16 17 driveway. Q Oh, so he lived right nearby. Is that right? 18 19 A Yes, he lived right next door. Q Okay. Well then when he -- I take it then when he 20 drove off on Empire Street, did he just drive into his 21 22 driveway and stop? A I don't -- I don't know which way he went once he 23

got on Empire Street. 1 Q From the time you arrived at the credit union and 2 got out of your car, would it be fair to say that you kept 3 your eyes on the station pretty much, gas station? 4 (A) Not -- my eyes glued to the front of the station, 5 I'm scanning the area looking for several of the things 6 we just talked about a minute ago. 7 Q And from the time you pulled up until you actually 8 went into the station you saw no one either go into or leave 9 Is that right? the station. 10 (A) No, I did not. 11 Q Officer, do you recall telling Mr. Martinez to leave 12 the parking lot as you were approaching on foot? 13 No, I never told him that. 14 So your recollection is you did not tell him to do 15 that? 16 I don't recall -- I never spoke with him at all 17 until he was in his drive. Q Officer, right before -- I've only got a few more questions for you. I just want to make sure that I'm clear on the time frame and the sequence of things here. You received the call from dispatch about 8:18 directing you to the scene where there was a possible holdup alarm -- a holdup going on. It took you I believe two to three minutes to get there. When you arrived, you parked your car behind the vehicles to the west of the credit union building and you were scanning the area as you got out of your car and moved to the front of the credit union property you were scanning the Clark station across Empire Street, correct?

A That among other things, yes.

Q Okay. When you pulled up and parked your vehicle, do you remember seeing whether or not Mr. Martinez at that time was engaged in filling his tires apparently?

A When I picked up on him being in the lot I had already gotten out of my squad car and walked around to the front side of the credit union.

1	Q And at that time you saw him filling his tires,
2	correct?
3	A) I believe so, yes.
4	Q You then made your observation of the tag on his car
