On 04-11-91 Randy Howard came to the police station to speak with me about Mike Conneely. Myself and Sgt. Bernardini of the Illinois State DCI Task Force 6 then showed him a picture of a facimile of Mike Conneely and asked him if he knew who it was. Howard stated he was 95% sure it was the Mike Conneely he knew but the copy of the picture was of poor quality. I then asked him if he knew anything about a large quantity of cigarettes. Howard stated he was given a grocery type of bag containing ten to twelve cartons of Winstons. Howard stated Mike gave him the cigarettes at Mary Cooper's house in her bedroom and told him not to say anything to Steve Clinard because he would get mad. Howard said he took them home and left them in his vehicle. The next day Conneely came over to Howards house and wanted some of the cartons of cigarettes back. Howard stated he told Conneely they were in the car and threw him the keys. Howard did not know how many cartons Conneely took back. Two days later Conneely came over to Howard's house again for some money. Howard stated all he had on him was twenty dollars and gave it to him and Conneely told him that would be alright.

I then asked him about the lottery tickets that Detective Barkes retrieved from his apartment and where he got them. Howard stated that Conneely gave him the tickets and he thought Steve Clinard had some. Howard denied being involved in the theft of lottery tickets.

Howard stated he took for granted that Jamie was involved because he knew of the facts of each case and would make comments and ask if Howard had read the paper about the burglary to Harper gas station.

Howard was asked if he knew the cigarettes were stolen and he said he knew they were because of the price but didn't know where they were stolen from.

Howard also stated that Jamie had told him about the Bus Station robbery and mentioned the amount of the first armed robbery of 1,500 dollars and the second armed robbery of 900 dollars, both from the bus station. Jamie also told Howard that Conneely had probably done the armed robbery to the bus station and the burglary to Harpers gas station
